DEFENCE PACILITIES IN THE INDIAN OCEAN

7. The Fourth Committee of the United Nations has now reached the item on Eiscellaneous Territories and may well discuss Mauritius and Deychelles next week. If they raise the question of defence arrangements on the Indian Ocean Islands before we have detached them, the Mauritius Government will be under considerable pressure to withdraw their agreement to cur proposals. Moreover we should lay curselves open to an additional charge of dishonesty if we evaded the defence issue in the Fourth Committee and then made the Order in Council immediately afterwards. It is therefore important that we should be able to present the U.N. with a fait accompli-
